What Can I Do With.....?

Rosemary: Rosemary is an aromatic herb used in a variety of dishes, such as soups, casseroles, salads, and stews. Although it resembles pine in both appearance and scent, rosemary is actually a member of the same botanical family as sage & mint. It can be used to flavor olive oils and cheeses. The popular combination of rosemary and olive oil has found its way into crackers, chips, and soft cheese spreads. Keep fresh in the refrigerator with a damp paper towel.
