THE GARDEN SPOT

What Can I Do With Parsley?

Margie Poorman says:

The two main groups of parsley used as herbs are **French**, or **curly leaf** and, **Italian**, or **flat leaf**. We have both in our Northcrest herb garden and harvest both for resident's use.

- * It's easy to think of <u>parsley</u> as a garnish but it's such a versatile herb. Fresh, clean, and slightly earthy, parsley packs an herbaceous punch perfect for brightening up any dish.
- * Treat it like any other leafy green and mix it in with other lettuces to add a punch.
- * Stir it into a grain or bean salad, or throw it into a frittata or a sauce.
- * When stored properly (with the ends trimmed and in a glass of water in the fridge or wrapped in a damp paper towel and placed in a plastic bag), it will last for close to two weeks.

Computer Scams

- 1. Your phone can be hacked as well as your computer.

- 5. The federal government or law enforcement will never ask you for personal information over the phone or on line.
- 6. Some hacks can take over your volume and scare you with loud noises. Immediately shut down and reboot. This goes for both phones and computers.
