

Our Favorite Artwork

Grand Room Gallery July & August 2022 Twenty-seven households at Northcrest each lent an art piece for this summer's exhibit in the Grand Room. Media varied widely: pen and ink, acrylic on canvas, watercolor, prints, marquetry, dyed African mud-cloth, three-dimensional quilting, even butterfly wings. Iowa artists were well represented, including Jane Baty, P. Buckley Moss, Priscilla Sage, and Jo Myers Walker. Treasured pieces often came from the hand of a family member: wife, father, daughter, son, aunt. The youngest artist, nine years old, had used tissue and ink in a sort of textural collage. Other pieces represent a memorable trip or life-experience.
