THE GARDEN SPOT

What Can I Do With? Cilantro



Cilantro is a fast-growing, aromatic, annual herb that grows best in the cooler weather of spring. This herb is used to flavor many recipes, and the entire plant is edible, though the leaves and seeds are used most frequently. Cilantro and coriander are different parts of the same plant. Cilantro refers to the leaves of the plant, which are used as an herb. This describes the vegetative stage of the plant's life cycle. Coriander refers to the seeds, which are typically ground and used as a spice. This happens after the plant flowers and develops the seeds. Cilantro does not grow in summer heat as the plants will bolt (much like rhubarb in the heat) and the cilantro leaves will be past harvesting. Thus the cilantro season here at Northcrest herb garden is coming to an end. It is a popular herb here at Northcrest and we hope you have enjoyed it. The plants will go to seed and provide the seeds which are a spice.

Chives

Chives are delicate and tender and are best eaten raw or cooked very briefly. Overcooking wilts and weakens their texture and flavor. Chives can be chopped or blended into small bits, which releases their oniony flavor. They also work well as a garnish (think: a topping for a baked potato and sour cream or deviled eggs). But they also make great additions to salad dressings and dips. Chive's purple flowers are edible too. We will be harvesting chives from Northcrest's herb garden till the end of the summer season and frost arrives.
