CONGATULATIONS! We all made it! On Thursday, May 11th, 2023, the Health and Human Services Department has ended the Public Health Emergency proclamation declaring COVID-19 as a national pandemic. As of today, May 11th, the remaining restrictions are lifted.

- 1. Screening for visitation, no need to stop at the Front Desk and receive a sticker
 - 2. Mandatory Masking
- 3. Visitors may go straight to Assisted Living, the Health Center and the Heartwood House. Keypads will have the codes displayed for entry into the areas.
- 4. Visitor dining with a resident in Assisted Living or the Health Center will continue in common areas, rooms or apartments due to seating availability. Visitor dining with residents in the HWH dining area will be based on table and chair availability.
